I'd draw your attention to the fact that unlike too many news organizations today--who tend to categorize a response at the foot of a story--we excerpt a subject's responses at length throughout our text, as well as placing a link to a screen capture of both their full response and the question that was posed.

Readers tell us that these practices provide a level of context missing in many articles, and serves to improve their confidence that the subject was given every opportunity to participate.

While of course we will run Mr. Moore's letter, Mr. Glassman and Catalyst/Callidus likely do have detailed responses to Bruce's specific questions.

As to Mr. Moore's letter, I'll simply address this point: Unequivocally, Bruce never worked for or with West Face Capital and/or its principals in any fashion, either formally or informally, nor he worked "against" Newton Glassman or Cadillus and Catalyst. He's never written a word about them.

West Face has stipulated that Bruce has no role or connection with it in their statement of defense and counterclaim, and its principals have done so on the record to SIRF. It should go without saying Bruce denies the allegation whole heartedly.
